#### Parish Council Meeting 23rd July 1981

#### Bynass

County Councillor Derwent Gibson attended the early part of the meeting. He came principally to discuss the proposed bypass of the village. He has written to Norman Fowler the minister responsible for deciding the route, asking for an appointment to discuss the subject, but has not been successful. The route has not been announced and no date has been given when it will be made public. Several members of the public complained that planning blight was affecting their houses. It was hoped that the application to the ombudsman on the grounds of mal-administration would result in a decision being announced shortly.

#### Old Churchyard

The hard work of the volunteers clearing the churchyard was praised, the job is now about three quarters finished. Representatives from Tynedale District Council are coming to make a report on how best to maintain it once the clearance work is finished.

#### Telephone Box

British Telecom will not supply signs to direct potential customers to their telephone boxes, so an alternative solution must be found if the whereabouts of the village telephone box is to be better known.

#### Parking in Ratcliffe Road

Concern was expressed at the parking of vehicles to the east of the pelican crossing as this effectively hides the left hand traffic signal from on-coming traffic.

#### Best Kent Village Connetition

Haydon Bridge has reached the finals in the Big Village section. If everyone pays particular attention to not dropping litter we may actually win, so please DOM'T DROP ANY LITTER.

#### Community Centre

The Parish Council agreed to donate £100 towards the cost of the repairs. Tynedale District Council are to be approached for a grant.

#### Hordley Acres

The stone wall was reported to be in a dangerous state and the fence onto the main road has a section missing again.

There is no Council meeting in August. The next meeting will be on 24th September 1981.

#### St Cuthbert's Cemetery

As some of you may already know, volunteers from within the village (and some from outside the village) in conjunction with Keep Britain Tidy, are clearing up this cemetery. The cemetery, beautifully situated on the hillside overlooking the village, has in the past been sadly neglected—indeed I have in my possession, courtesy of a member of the village, a copy of a letter to the Hexhan Courant dated May 1930 in which the writer calls for the "tidy-up" of the cemetery. Now 51 years later, action has finally been taken and the cemetery is not only accessable to any member of the public, but it is a pleasant place to walk in on a warm day.

Previously it was a difficult task to walk through the cemetery, and those who have consistently tended graves there over the years have had a great deal of difficulty in getting to those graves and trying to keep paths clear.

I am so pleased at the response we've had from various people within the village who have worked very hard over the past month, and overwhelmed by the enormous progress that has been made. There is now only a small section left to clear, but I'm sure that this will be completed fairly-soon. Anyone who wishes to do a little work on the site has only to sign out the tools which are kept in a shed behind the Vicarage (there's no need to bother the Vicar) or better still, just turn up at any time with your own tools.

It is hoped that eventually we may be able to put in some sort of bench clike there used to be) and that, although a cemetery, it will become a place in Haydon Bridge where members of the community can while away a few peaceful hours. Many headstones have been re-discovered after having been hidden for many years under the growth which over-ran the place. Perhaps you have some relatives buried there but, over the years, have been unable to visit their graves, or perhaps you just want to see what's going on - whatever the reason, take time for a walk up there, and see what the village has done for itself at a cost of the volunteers' own spare time, and a few scratches, cuts and aching backs.

A worthwhile and long-avaited job has been started and there is only a small portion left to do, so perhaps you can help to finish it. Finally, I would like to add that I now have in my possesion a letter which categorically states that the District Council will maintain the cemetery once we have finished clearing it, and I might add further that during a recent visit by two men from the District Council it was remarked that a "tremendous effort had previously been put into the

project for it to have reached the stage it has reached after such a short time".

Thanks to everyone who is helping, and those who are going to help after reading this.
