Parish Council Pickings 25 October 1984

Councillors present: 6 Apologies : 5

That footpath again Two members of the public addressed the council on the subject of whether a public right of way ought to exist in Temple House Lane. There was a good deal of discussion about legal technicalities and an intriguing reference to an old lady who had burnt some title deeds in circumstances not explained to the meeting. Eventually the council decided that the matter ought to be finally ~~settled~~ settled one way or the other, and the Clerk was asked to collect what evidence she could from people who could say from their own knowledge what the past practice had been and who were willing if necessary, to appear before an official tribunal hearing to give evidence. The strength of this evidence will then be discussed informally with the County Footpaths Officer, since he will be the man who has to defend a decision to put the path on the Definitives maps. More about this next month, no doubt. However, in the meantime if you want to give evidence for or against the question, please get in touch with the Parish Clerk.

Radcliffe Road Back Lane. It was reported that Tynedale District are having a scheme prepared for surfacing the lane through the "Railway Tunnel". They are not however proposing to bring it up to a standard at which they can adopt it.

Rubbish again Tynedale District discussed the problem of "fly-tipping", (which seems to be the technical term for dumping rubbish in the wrong place) but reached no conclusion. The County however is to call a meeting of interested Councils to talk about it again. Meanwhile, the County has refused to provide a skip in the village on the various ground that they fear it is so badly needed that it will have to be emptied more often than they can afford to it. The Parish Council thought that such a decision should be taken by the relevant Committee rather than by the Chief Officer, and decided to ask Mr Gibson to follow up the matter. The litter bins in the lay-bys to the East of the village were removed by mistake, and will be put back.

Plans have been passed, without comment, for building a bungalow and a new sawmill shed at West Mill Hills. The question was raised whether the sawmill should be working at weekends.

Inconvenience The public toilets are now locked at night, following comprehensive and imaginative vandalisation some two months ago. Sorry †
