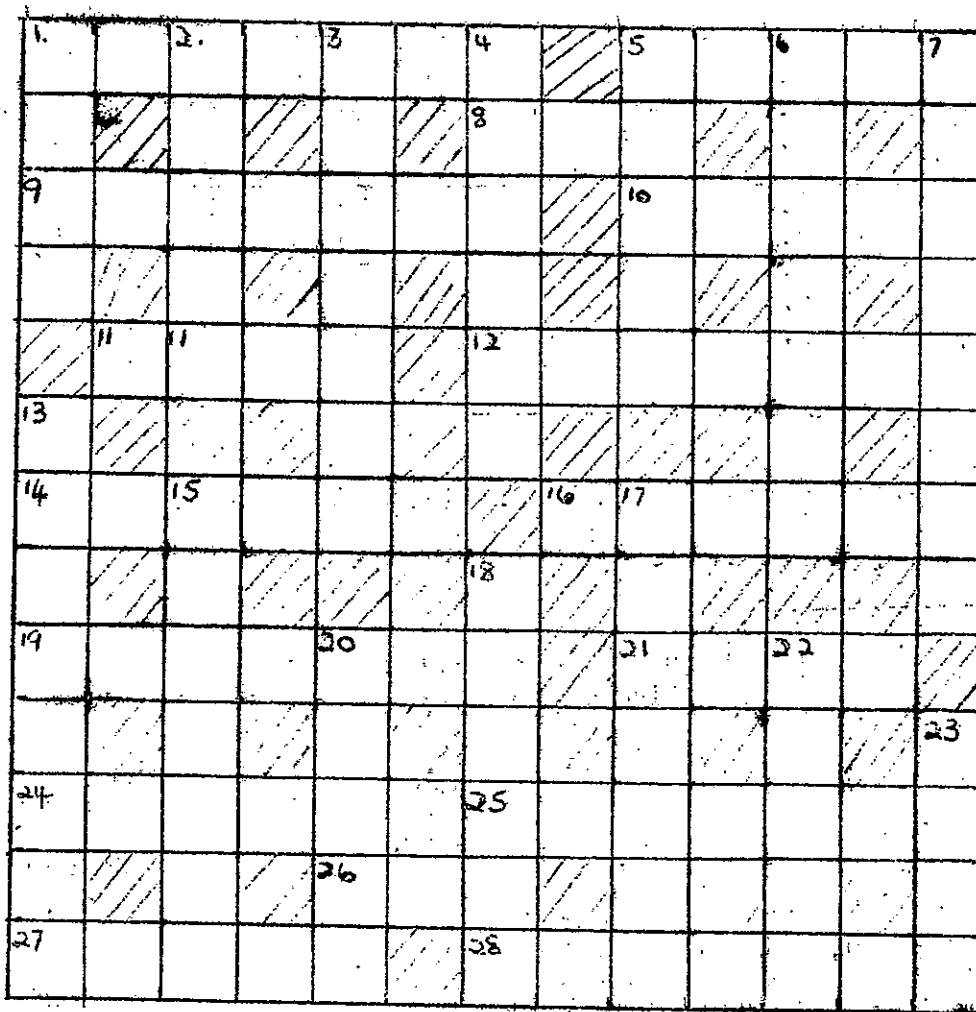

PARISH COUNCIL PICKINGS. 27 SEPTEMBER 1984

Councillors returned refreshed from their summer holiday. Nine were present, and the remaining two sent their apologies.

A FOOTNOTE?

Having decided two months ago to confirm its proposal that Temple House Lane should be entered on the definitive County Map as a public right of way, the council has now been informed by the solicitor acting for Mrs. Thompson that its designation will be opposed. The Chairman said that he has been trying to find out who would pay for the opposition to the opposition, but had not yet received an answer. Assuming that the Parish will be called on to foot the bill, the council wanted to be sure that there is an agreeable case for classifying it as a right of way: it is not certain that those people who made the original claim are still available to give evidence on the matter. Will anybody who is ready to give information which supports that a right of way exists please get in touch with the Parish Clerk (Mrs. C. Swaddle, Haydon Bridge 498), so that the decision whether or not to enter it can be taken at the meeting on 25th October, or better still, come to the meeting at 7.30pm IN THE COMMUNITY CENTRE and say what you want to say then.

RUBBISH

With the closure of Fourstones ~~xxx~~ Road tip, the council has been trying to get a skip sited in the village. Needless to say, the council says it hasn't got the money; Frankham is only 5½ miles away; other towns and villages in Northumberland have to travel farther; and Tynedale District has more than its fair share of skips anyway. The Parish Council agreed to enquire whether a financial contribution would help the County's mind, being ever conscious of the attractive tipping sites - such as GEE'S WOOD and the RIVER BANKS - which will otherwise be made use of. Tipping in Gee's Wood is already making a nonsense of the clearing work being done on Low Fall culvert to prevent flooding. At the same time, the County is conducting a survey of sites where unauthorised tipping takes place (one hopes with the intention of keeping them cleared or preventing it happening). If you have a local eyesore, make sure you inform the Parish Clerk about it.

An interesting feature of the new lay-bys to the West of the village is their brand new litter-bins, which have been installed even though the County Council has decided it can't afford to empty the ones in the old lay-bys to the East.

HIGHWAYS

Contractors have been re-laying the asphalt on the footways over the bridge. Apparently rainwater got in and caused the first lot to lift. If what they have done covers it successfully, a full repair job will be done.

HIGHWAYS CONTINUED

Long vehicles are still getting lost on the way to Allendale after crossing the Ridley Hall bridge. The County Council's view is that since nobody told them to go that way to Allendale, they have nobody to blame but themselves.

Why, the planning Council wondered, is nothing happening at the "Watsons Garage" junction?

There were applications for more living accomodstion in the village - a new house on the site in Haugh House Lane and a conversion job at Eastern Garage. No comments from the Parish.

ODDS AND ENDS

Tynedale D C is buying an electricity meter worked by tokens to provide lighting for the squash courts.

The insurance premium for 16 public seats will be £96 pa.

The Water Authority is not offering any payment for conducting a census of unused water sources in the Parish. It was agreed they should be advised to consult Old Hexham A.D.C. archives.

Comments to the County STRUCTURAL PLAN are due at Morpeth on 29th October. If you want the Parish to make any representation, come to the meeting on the 25th October, or get in touch with the Clerk.

Finally, the Parish Council advises you to buy a return ticket when you board the train at Haydon Bridge, and so avoid the spiders web of rules and regulations about "OPEN STATIONS". Such as Newcastle and Hexham.
