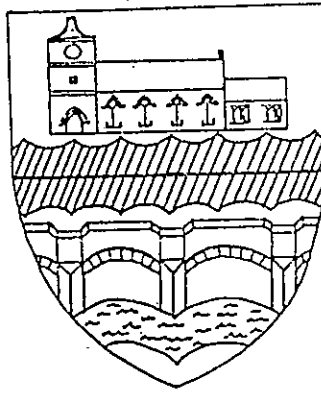

PARISH COUNCIL PICKINGS

(Meeting of 23 October)

Five Councillors present, plus one late-comer

The most important item as far as the Friends of Haydon Bridge are concerned was the decision to contribute £150 towards the cost of a new printing machine for Haydon News. We are most grateful, not only for the money, but also for the acknowledgment by the Parish Council that we do a useful job which is worthy of support.

Mr Drydon reported about his meeting with British Telecom on the subject of the telephone box. The outcome appears to be -

that it will be moved to a site on the pavement west of the Co-op:

that it will operate as a card-box, with no provision for accepting coins. Cards (minimum cost £1) will be available at several places in the village:

that the Grindon and Langley boxes will be replaced and remain coin-operated:

that there is no chance of another box being installed elsewhere in the village.

Coal exploration is to take place right on the southern fringe of the Parish, but nobody is in favour of opencast working for coal at Stublick, even though they say there is a million tons there.

The "Infobus" announced its intention of parking in Church Street. The Council thought that this would turn out to be pretty inconvenient just at the time when the school buses were leaving, but has no power to stop it doing so. Maybe we shall hear more on this at the next meeting.

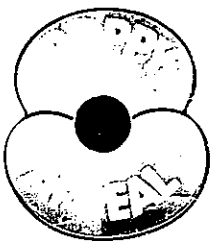

ESKDALE OUTWARD BOUND

I have just returned from a very enjoyable, physically demanding but extremely rewarding three weeks at the Eskdale Outward Bound Mountain School.

The course started for me by meeting the people who were to be my companions (male and female) during my stay at Eskdale. We came from all parts of the U.K. and abroad. The team we worked in also came from all walks of life.

Our day started at 6.45am with a run round the tarn, and then a jump in the water ! It wakes you up. The first two days of the first week were concentrated on getting on with the people in your patrol, learning important basic first aid, elementary rock climbing and canoeing. This was followed by the first expedition which lasted three days and gets you used to mountain walking and high level camping. During this week instructors are supervising at all times.

The second week the instructors take a back seat and only intervene if required. There is a second expedition, more difficult session of rock climbing and canoeing, plus 'the solo'. The solo as the name implies; is being left on your own. You are taken to a hill, allocated a piece of ground, given a plastic sheet, a piece of string and food rations for forty hours. This is the time you are expected to remain there. You are also given a pen and notebook to write down your thoughts; finally your watch is taken from you.

This is a unique opportunity to get to know yourself; to think about your future; to realise how much people mean to you and catch up with much needed sleep.

The weather during the complete course was most inclement it included Hurricane Charlie, but I was quite pleased that my efforts to build some sort of shelter did keep me dry and warm.

The last week is taken up preparing for the final; which you do in a team of five or six. The final is a three day expedition in which you have to climb as many peaks as possible without help from the instructors. It is the climax to the course when everything you have been taught is tested.

It has been a three weeks experience in that I made new friends, enjoyed a sense of achievement and had great fun doing it.

My thanks to Haydon Bridge Outward Bound, Dr. High and my parents for making it possible
